...many issues appeared during the period. These include council's lack of internal controls, inadequate policies and procedures, and an overall lack of respect for compliance.






Integrity systems

- Promoting a <u>culture of integrity</u> requires coherent efforts to define expected standards of conduct, provide guidance and incentives, as well as monitor them in daily practice to ensure compliance.
- It also calls for <u>pro-active</u> efforts ... to anticipate risks to integrity, identify sources of corruption and apply tailored countermeasures.
- Transparency is increasingly used as an instrument to foster accountability and control in relation to government functioning and processes to reinforce public trust.

Control frameworks

- Efficient and effective operations
- Reliable financial reporting
- Compliance with laws



The control environment: principles

- entity demonstrates commitment to integrity and ethical values
- governing body demonstrates independence from management and exercises oversight of the design and performance of internal control
- management establishes structures, reporting lines, and appropriate authorities and responsibilities in the pursuit of objectives
- entity demonstrates a commitment to attract, develop, and retain competent individuals in alignment with objectives
- individuals held accountable for their internal control responsibilities in the pursuit of objectives

Too much of a good thing?

- The proliferation of oversight agencies and a vigorous media are making public servants and politicians alike timid and risk averse. While sunlight is a good protector against corruption, too much of it can be blinding.
- While each individually might be a good thing in their own right, together, and in combination with the media cycle, they breed a timidity and an often undesirable risk aversion amongst both elected officials and public officials.
- ...it's also true that too much light is blinding and it leaves you uncertain about where you are and where you're going. And I think we're in that sort of moment where we are somewhat blinded.
