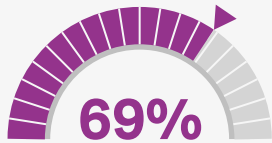
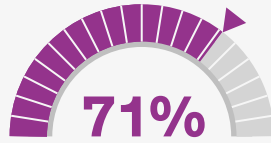


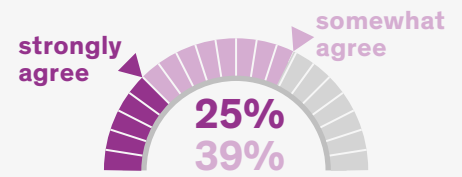
Snapshot: Victorian community perceptions of corruption survey 2022

Most Victorians agree that they know what behaviour constitutes corruption

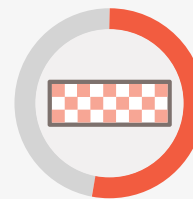


Two thirds of Victorians agree that corruption is a problem in Victoria

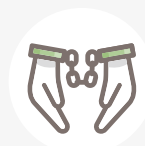


One third of Victorians agree that **'if I reported corruption, I would experience personal repercussions'**

Over one third of Victorians agree that **'if I reported corruption, meaningful action would be taken'**; most have no formed opinion (37% 'neither agree nor disagree', 15% 'don't know')
