

a Victoria Police officer fabricated evidence in relation to the drug and alcohol testing of three drivers. IBAC found that the Victoria Police officer did fabricate evidence. IBAC also identified deficiencies in the Victoria

an investigation into three separate allegations of excessive use of force by Victoria Police officers in the same local area. IBAC substantiated one of the allegations of excessive use of force. IBAC also found that a Victoria Police internal investigation was inadequate. IBAC made a number of
