

For example




- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people




- people from **CALD** backgrounds.

CALD means someone might




- speak a language that is **not** English

LGBTIQA+ can be about


- who you are attracted to




- your **gender**.

We want you to


- know about what we do



- feel safe to tell us about corruption




- trust us to do the right thing.

Goal 2


Help our staff work better with you



We will help our staff be **inclusive** and **respect** you.

Inclusive means

- everyone is welcome
- everyone can join in.



Respect means we understand that

- everyone is important
- we should be kind to everyone
- we should **not** hurt other people.

- your **rights**.

Rights are the things that everyone should be able to

Goal 3

Make our services more accessible



Accessible services mean

- you can get the services in different ways



- the services are easy to use.



We will work with you to make it easier to tell us about corruption.



To make our events easier to access we will

- use captions to show what people say at online events



- use **Auslan** when needed.

Auslan is the language of the Australian deaf community.



We will always do an **Acknowledgement of country** at our events.



Acknowledgement of country means we show our respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.



We will make information that

- is easy to understand for the reader
 - for example, Easy English



- is right for your community
 - for example, in different languages



- is for everyone



- respects your rights.




How will we make sure the goals happen?


